Reproduce and laminate the pictures on the following pages to serve as "links" or "anchors" for remembering the names of letters. Display as a word wall for easy visibility for young children. Use for shared reading on a daily basis with a pointer. This helps to build fluency in letter recognition.

Alternative: Use as sorting mats with plastic letters.

Alternative: Assemble in book format and read as follows, touching the letters and the pictures with the index finger: "A, a, alligator." Do not say "A is for alligator." The purpose of this is letter recognition and fluency.

Alternative: Allow children to read the alphabet word wall with a pointer as an independent activity during centers.

Note: make sure to go over the pictures with young children to make sure that they know what they represent for these activities.
