## "Look it up!" said Mom. <br> What to do when the "most of the time" rule doesn't work!

$>$ If it sounds as if it starts with f , and it doesn't, it will start with ph.
> If it sounds as if it starts with $n$, and it doesn't, try kn (the mostly likely alternative), then try $9 n$, (much rarer), then try pn.
$>$ If it sounds as if it starts with k , and it doesn't, try c (most common).
Then try ch (rare).
$>$ If it sounds like $k w$, try qu.
$>$ If it sounds as if it starts with $\mathbf{j}$, and it doesn't, try $\mathbf{g}$.
$>$ If it sounds as if it starts with $r$, and it doesn't, try wr before trying rh.
$>$ If it sounds as if it starts with S, and it doesn't, try ps.
$>$ If it sounds as if it starts with $t$, and it doesn't, try $\mathbf{P}$.
$>$ If it sounds as if it starts with 0, and it doesn't, try $\mathbf{h}$.
$>$ If it sounds as if it starts with a particular vowel, and it doesn't, try all the other vowels until you find it.
$>$ Remember: $q$ is always followed by $u$, and $w$ is often followed by $h$.
