Activities

• Children use the shoe bag to sort the names by beginning letter.

- Re-label the shoe bag and have children sort by number of syllables.
- Create other labels to focus on specific letters (begins with s, ends with s, more than one s, no s, begins with sh, st).
- Create picture labels. Sort beginning sound.
- Make names with magnetic letters.
- Label the pocket chart girls and boys. Place the children's pictures in the correct column. Children match names to pictures.
- Use the names chart to draw and label pictures of friends.
- Use butcher paper as a sign-in chart. Children respond to a yes or no question under an appropriate number or picture.
- Use a set of name cards for taking attendance or lunch count.
- Use name cards for surveys or for graphing responses.
- Make an envelope or pouch for each child. Include a laminated copy of the name to refer to, a name puzzle to reconstruct, magnetic letters or tiles for spelling the name, and a laminated photo of the child. Allow children to use the pouches during center time as a take-it-to-your-seat center.
- Type and print names in assorted fonts and colors for sorting.
- Add middle and/or last names later in the year (kindergarten) as an option.
- Refer to the names chart during shared or demonstrated writing for accessing beginning and ending sound spellings.
