Clustering/Brainstorming

Why?

- * Clustering or brainstorming is a way for students to generate a wealth of ideas in a very short time without elaborating on any one.
- * Clustering shows a visual representation that allows students to see relationships between and among facts and ideas.
- * Clustering generates the flow of ideas on any given topic.
- * Clustering serves as a prewrite for journals, learning logs or report writing.
- * Clustering may be useful for chapter test review.

How?

- * Write one word on the board or chart paper.
- * Option 1: Students collaboratively use free association or brainstorming to "cluster" other words around it. Teacher records.
- * Option 2: Students write the word on their paper and independently use free association and brainstorming to cluster words around it.
- * Option 3: Students may work in pairs or in small groups.
- * All suggestions should be accepted and added to the cluster.
- * Accumulate ideas as quickly as possible, letting one thing lead to another.
- Worry about spelling and grammar later!
- * Students select one branch of the cluster or a series of related words to use as a writing topic.
- * Optional application: provide specific categories for clusters.
