Narrator 3: One day, Little Red Riding Hood's mother said to her . . .

Narrator 3: Along the way, she met her good friend, The Jolly Postman.

Postman: Where are you going, Little Red?

- Little Red: I'm going to the other side of Friendly Forest to visit my grandma. She isn't feeling very well today, so I'm taking her a lovely basket of sweets and treats and a spot of tea. I'm sure that it will make her feel better.
- BBWolf: What a good girl you are! Where does your grandma live?
- Narrator 2: Little Red Riding Hood decided that this would be too much information for the Big Bad Wolf and she told him so.
- Little Red: My mother told me not to talk to strangers. The Jolly Postman told me not to talk to strangers. The Three Little Pigs told me not to talk to strangers and my friend, Goldilocks, told me not to talk to strangers. Good-bye, Mr. Big Bad Wolf!
- Narrator 2: With that, Little Red Riding Hood hurried on her way to her Grandma's house.

- Narrator 3: When Little Red Riding Hood got to Grandma's house, she knocked on the door, but no one came to let her in.
- Little Red: I know that Grandma must be here. Mother said that she isn't feeling very well today. I hope that the Big Bad Wolf didn't come and bother her!
- Narrator 1: We all know that in the real story of Little Red Riding Hood, the Big Bad Wolf is a terrible wolf with great big eyes, and great big ears and great big teeth.
- Narrator 2: We don't like the way that story ends, so we have a different ending for you!
- Narrator 3: Little Red Riding Hood remembered what her mother had said to her that morning.
- Mother: If she doesn't answer the bell, just lift the latch and go right in . . .
- Narrator 1: and so she did. It was very quiet in Grandma's house, but then . . .
- All: Surprise!!!!
- Narrator 2: yelled her parents, her grandma and all of her good friends.
- Little Red: Why, Mother and Papa! How did you get here?! How did all of you get here before me?
- Papa: We wanted to have a tea party with Grandma and all of your friends.
- Mother: It was Grandma's idea to surprise you.
- Little Red: Oh, Grandma, you must be feeling better!
- Grandma: I wasn't sick at all. My new friend, The Big Bad Wolf, isn't so bad after all. He's not going to be a bully anymore. He agreed to keep you talking in the forest for a few minutes so that everyone could come and get ready to surprise you.
