Assembly

Materials:

- ◆ Category cards (*ies, s, es*)
- ◆ Point cards (100, 200, 300, 400, 500, Bonus)
- ◆ Answer cards (definitions only)
- ◆ Answer key for teacher (attached)
- ◆ Large pocket chart
- ◆ Score sheet

To play

- ◆ Player/team chooses category and point value.
- ◆ Teacher turns the answer card over and reads the definition
- ◆ Student/team then provides the answer in question format and spells the word.

Ex: Student: "I'll take *-ies* for 100."

Teacher: "another word for women"

Student: What are ladies? l-a-d-i-e-s.

- ◆ Bonus round: Each student/team chooses a bonus question and makes a wager from their points.
