


# LEARNING ABC'S WITH A SCHOOL OF FISH!

Goldie, the goldfish, and her sister capital letters go to school with Lilac and her sister lower case letters.

Duplicate two sets of the cards on card stock and laminate for durability. Be sure to play this game with your students in small groups (2 or 3) before allowing them to play independently.

The purpose of this game is to make pairs following the traditional Go Fish and Memory or Concentration rules and to reinforce letter knowledge. For instance, Jake, who has the Goldie letter J may ask another child, "Brody, do you have the letter j?" Children just love to play and count the number of cards they accumulate during a game.

Another way to use the cards: cut the cards apart and place in a center so that children can explore and match the capital and lowercase letters or put them in ABC order. Use it as a floor activity or in a pocket chart.

Directions for assembly:

Duplicate two sets of cards and laminate for durability.  
Cut out and store in an envelope using the label above.
